

The 2018-2019 Academic Year Scholarship Announcement for Rosen College Students

The Scholarship Committee is pleased to announce our internal scholarships for the 2018-2019 Academic Year. The list of scholarships is at the end of this announcement. The total amount pledged by many sponsor organizations is already significant; and it is expected to grow. The committee addresses many different aspects of our students' endeavor for scholarships. Please read the following details; and apply.

<u>Qualifications</u>: All applicants who meet with the following conditions are encouraged to apply.

- i. A current student majoring in at least one of the degrees offered by the Rosen College. Those who have yet to decide majors can also apply.
- At least 9 credit hours taken in the fall of 2018 and in the spring of 2019. Seniors who are graduating this fall (Dec. 2018) may also apply as long as they are taking 9 credit hours or more.
- iii. The overall GPA must be at least 2.5 or higher at the time of application; and it must be maintained until the scholarship expires.

- **b-1**: An essay within 1,000 words blending the following topics:
 - Why college education is important to you; and why you decided to study at the UCF Rosen College (for the major you have chosen).
 - Optionally, you may add a few other topics of your choice that can help us determine the sincerity to award scholarships to you. Examples may include, but are not limited to, the following:



- ✓ The strengths and weaknesses of yourself; and how you are planning on developing your intellectual capability
- ✓ How Rosen College can help you; and become a better educational institution
- ✓ Any other topics that you consider are important to present yourself
- Please submit an <u>Unofficial Transcript</u> (NOT an Audit Report) to Dr. H. Jung (RCHM #255) by no later than September 14, 2018 (Friday). This can be obtained at the Student Service (RCHM #201). Please be advised Audit Reports will <u>NOT be accepted</u>; and it will automatically disqualify your application.
- ii. Applicants must complete the online application by 5:00 p.m., <u>September 14 (Friday)</u>.Click the following link for the online application.

 - Submission of separate files or a file with incorrect file name will not be accepted; and will automatically disqualify the application.

The deadline of the application is 5:00 p.m. September 14, 2017 (Friday).

When all records are consolidated; applicants will be notified of the application status through the "knights" e-mail submitted in the online application.

Scholarship Information for Rosen College Students

• The Rosen College of Hospitality Management (RCHM) offers scholarships to all qualified Rosen College students based on the following criteria:

- o Academic performance
- o Industry/work experience
- o Involvement in College activities/community reach-out/philanthropic activities
- Leadership capability/experience; maturity & sincerity
- o Other recognizable accomplishments and awards
- Selection process:
 - Announcements are made in the beginning of each academic year (late August or early September) through the following channels:
 - On this RCHM web site
 - The official listserv e-mail (using the "knights" e-mail system).
 - Students submit one application; then the committee creates a large pool of qualified applicants; and selects the best candidates for each scholarship depending on their credentials that meet with specific requirements of sponsors.
 - The same pool is continuously used throughout the academic year to select appropriate candidates for additional/external scholarships when requested by sponsors.
- Application materials (*Please refer to the previous pages for details*):
 - Online application
 - Resume & Essay (* in a single Word document file)
 - Unofficial Transcript (* This is not an Audit Report.)
- Other requirements:
 - Only the complete applications will be reviewed for selection.
 - Selected recipients must comply with the following requirements:
 - Additional requirements of the sponsor organization, if any (ex: photo op, attending their ceremonies, etc.).
 - Must submit the Letter of Acceptance with commitment. Forms will be delivered with the notice.
 - Must attend the Scholarship Award Ceremony. The details of the ceremony will be announced by the preparation team through "knights" e-mail when it is determined.
- Other notes:
 - **Failure** to comply with any of the above may, and will revoke the scholarship privilege.
 - Scholarships are distributed <u>retroactively</u> at the end of the fall semester by one half; and the other half will be distributed in the following spring semester.

- All scholarship will be distributed retroactively in two semesters (fall & spring) by half. For this reason, recipients must take care of their financial dues by themselves; and then they will be reimbursed.
