

Scholarship Opportunities 2019-2020 Academic Year

Rosen College awards numerous scholarships each year. In 2018 the college awarded more than \$300,000 to deserving students. The Rosen College Scholarship Committee is responsible for the application process, reviewing applications and awarding scholarships to current Rosen College students and new/ incoming students that have declared undergraduate majors in Hospitality Management, Event Management, Restaurant and Foodservice Management and Entertainment Management. Scholarships are also available to students in the Master's and Ph.D. programs, though they are limited. Both domestic and international students may apply for these scholarships.

Scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic criteria as well as any combination of financial need, campus/community activities, leadership positions and work experience.

Scholarships range from \$1,000 to \$7,000. Awards are divided equally for Fall Semester and Spring Semester. These scholarships are not available for the Summer Semester.

All scholarship recipients must comply with the following requirements:

- Return the forms and letter of acceptance by the date indicated in your award letter.
- Select Scholarship Donors/Sponsors may require a photo opportunity with the recipient, request that you attend a ceremony, conference or meeting where you will be recognized.
- Must attend the Rosen College Scholarship Ceremony. Details will be send to your Knights e-mail account.
- Failure to comply with any of the requirements may result in the scholarship being revoked.

Current UCF Rosen College Students returning for Fall 2019:

- Must be enrolled as a full-time student (12 or more hours for an undergraduate students and 9 or more hours for a graduate student) during the Fall and Spring Semester of the 2019-2020 academic year.
 - Students graduating in fall 2020 may apply.

- Completed application and all required documents must be submitted by 5 p.m. Friday, February 22, 2019, to be considered for the 2019-2020 scholarships.
- You will need to have a Knights e-mail account for all scholarship communication including award notification.
- You will need to a have your UCF ID number to complete the Scholarship Application.
- Applications are considered based on Academic Performance, Industry Experience and Philanthropic Activities.

- Submit a hard copy of your UNOFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT to Dr. Jung's Office at the RCHM 255.
 - You may obtain an unofficial transcript at the Student Services Office, RCHM 201.
 - Electronic Submissions and Degree Audits will not be accepted.

New Incoming Freshman, Transfer and Graduate Students:

- Must be enrolled as a full-time student (12 or more hours for an undergraduate students and 9 or more hours for a graduate student) during the Fall and Spring Semester of the 2019-2020 academic year.
- New students that have been admitted for Summer 2019 may apply for these scholarships. You do not have to start at UCF during the Fall 2019 semester.

- You will need to a have your UCF ID number to complete the Scholarship Application.

- Completed application and all required documents must be submitted by 5 p.m. Friday, February 22, 2019, to be considered for the 2019-2020 scholarships.
- Applications are considered based on Academic Performance, Industry Experience and Philanthropic Activities.
