Resources

The Rosen College provides an abundant amount of resources for our students to prepare for this event. We recommend having resumes prepared to hand out on resume paper, and students are able to get 5 free resume sheets per week through the Rosen Life office on campus. There are several preparatory workshops Rosen offers that are usually affiliated with Career Services. Examples of what is offered are mock interviews, appointments, resume and cover letter reviews, and business card assistance. Whether a career fair is online or face-to-face, it is important to show up as your best self, which includes looking the part. Dress comfortably and professionally, to have a perfect mixture for success. UCF and the Rosen College provide opportunities to purchase professional clothing for students at discounted prices called Suit-Up events.

When meeting someone for the first time, whether casually or formally, you always introduce yourself. So, this applies to the career fair when introducing yourself to a company representative. Practicing an elevator speech ahead of time will help you feel prepared, and know what to say about yourself. Bring plenty of resumes and business cards with you, and keep track of who you spoke to and who you took your information. You may be surprised at how many people you talk to, so it is better to be overprepared just in case. Research the companies you are interested in! This will help you make a plan and feel more comfortable, and will also show your interest to the professionals. Other Helpful Tips

During the event:

- Take your time, remain calm, and breathe
- Find a friend to go attend with you! Friends to go with can be a great support system
- If you are nervous about speaking with your top choice companies, warm up first by speaking with a few other companies beforehand
- On campus Rosen offers a headshot room, coaching room, relaxing room with a professional from UCF CAPS
- Be prepared just in case to stay longer if companies are doing on-site interviews at Rosen, nearby, or want to speak to you further

After the Fair:

- Make sure you have the information of who you spoke to from each company, so you can reference this later on
- Follow- up and thank the employers that you spoke with
