

Self-Guided Tour



Stop 1 - Student Services Suite (Room 201):

The **Student Services Suite** is home to several support offices including Undergraduate Admissions, Academic Advising, Communications and Marketing and Counseling.

Stop 2 – CFHLA Student Lounge (Room 202):

The **CFHLA Student Lounge** is a popular location for students to study, relax between classes, or hang out with friends. Students can enjoy a game of darts, watch television, or access the student offices for clubs and activities.

Stop 3 – Classroom (Rooms 205-213 and 103-111):

Please stop and listen at the door before entering the classroom. There may be a class in session. This campus features 22 classrooms of varying style. The learning environment each classroom creates is conducive for case studies, lectures, or small group discussions. Classrooms seat 45, 75, or 100 students in, for the most part, stadium style seating.

Stop 4 – Internships Office (Room 214):

This office houses our Internships Program Director and two internship instructors. The Rosen College of Hospitality Management's curriculum requires all Rosen College students to gain valuable professional development and knowledge in their field of study. Students enroll in three (3), 1-credit hour Internship courses, and gain valuable work experience prior to graduation in progressively more responsible, career driven positions.

Stop 5 - Computer Lab (Room 217):

The Rosen College has three cutting-edge computer labs available. Unlimited access is free for all Rosen College students, including technical support. In addition, the entire Rosen Campus features wireless internet, allowing students free access to the network.

Stop 6 - Anheuser-Busch Beer & Wine Lab (Room 126):

Please do not enter if there is a class in session. The **Anheuser-Busch Beer and Wine Lab** serves multiple purposes. Students can choose from a number of elective courses that focus on beverage management. The room includes storage for 2,000 bottles of wine and features two beers on tap. The three safety burners in the granite counter top are used for cooking demonstrations. The rotating camera above the counter projects to the three televisions. The recessed lighting at each of the seats is intended for beer and wine tasting.

Stop 7 - Disney Dining Room & Kitchen Labs (Room 124):

Please do not enter if there is an event underway. Please do not enter the kitchen labs. Students gain extensive hands-on experience with all aspects of the professional dining room and kitchen. We have two distinct kitchen styles: European station style and American line style. The kitchen labs consist of \$2.6 million worth of equipment for the students to utilize during studies. *Note: Rosen College is not a culinary school.*

Stop 8 - Barnes & Noble Campus Bookstore (Room 121):

The bookstore sells textbooks, Rosen College apparel, UCF memorabilia and other gifts. Students can purchase textbooks for all courses available at Rosen.

Stop 9 - Universal Orlando Foundation Library (Room 120):

The library serves the research needs and interests of the Rosen College students, faculty and staff. The library offers access to the main campus library including 1.5 million volumes and over 11,000 periodical subscriptions. Resources include computers access, subscriptions to numerous industry publications and group study rooms. The library also serves as a depository for the World Tourism Organization (WTO).

Stop 10 - The Darden Auditorium (Room 101):

The Darden Auditorium is a 400-seat space. Our 3,848 Square Foot Darden Auditorium is fully equipped to handle it all. With a surround sound music system, moving lights, wireless microphones, internet access and an up-to-the-minute computer console.
