Other opportunities for thanks and giving can be found in the Knights Helping Knights Pantry at Rosen College, also known as Pineapple Pantry. Since its ribbon cutting in the February 3, 2020, just a few weeks before the campus closed and moved to remote learning as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic, the pantry has been open in the fight against food insecurity. So far this fall semester, the pantry has distributed more than 250 pounds of food, especially peanut butter, Cup o' Noodles and shelf stable canned goods. Four student volunteers, Matthew Engel, Justin Pecoriello, Lauren Velazquez and Samuel Weisgal, manage food distribution at the pantry. The pantry accepts donations of non-perishable food items that can be placed in a box located outside the pantry door when the pantry is closed. You may also call 407-903-8056 to arrange to drop off a food donation. Monetary donations are accepted through the UCF Foundation at <u>https://foundation.ucf.edu/givetorosen</u>. The largest financial donation for the pantry to date was \$12,000 from the Langford Family Foundation. Thank you to all our generous donors. When students don't have to worry about where the next meal is coming from, they can concentrate on their studies and do better in their academic pursuits and their careers. The pantry will be relocating from its current space near the auditorium to a larger location in the campus' former fitness center. This will allow the pantry to have a refrigerator, so that students will be able to have fresh fruits and vegetable, eggs, cheese, milk and other nutritious foods that require refrigeration. The expansion will also allow for National Society of Minorities in

Hospitality (NSMH) Professional Career Closet to be housed in the pantry as well, and available year-round. The Career Closet provides professional attire for students for our bi-annual career fair, now it will be available for students in need who have interviews at any time of the year. The Career Closet accepts donations of new or used, clean, professional clothing for men and women, including jackets, ties, belt, pants, suits, work dresses, skirts and shoes. There is also a limited supply of casual clothing.

As we enter the season of Thanks and Giving, we at UCF Rosen College want to say thanks to all our stakeholders, industry partners and friends who have given us a reason to keep working diligently to remain the best college in the nation for hospitality education and research. Charge On!
