

### **Technology and Professional:**

On our first day at the National Film and Television School, we met with our NFTS contacts for an opening chat, then had a tour of the school's facilities. We then had our first workshop with Tom Fisher, titled "Building Stories, Brick by Brick," in which we flexed our creativity and discussed the importance of collaboration. Afterward, we had our second workshop of the day with Clare Cream and Poonam Sahota of the Marketing, Distribution, Sales, and Exhibition department titled, "Pitch Me, Baby," in which we learned tips for pitching our ideas and speaking publicly. Our final workshop of the day was "Sound Design for Film and Television" with Guy Hake. In the evening, we attended a screening and Q&A for two student films, Death of the Gods and Christmas in Antwerp, which both blew me away.

On our second day, we split into small groups and participated in a practical workshop in which we shot a scene! It was an enlightening experience to collaborate as a team to get our scene cast, blocked, and shot in just a few hours. In the evening, we had the pleasure to attend a live Zoom Q&A with Christopher McQuarrie, filmmaker who most recently co-wrote and produced Top Gun: Maverick, and Eddie Hamilton, editor on Top Gun: Maverick and other major films. It was really interesting to hear valuable advice from these two professionals and learn from their vast experience in the industry.

Throughout the rest of our first week, we attended workshops with Sound Recordist Lawrence Gartshore, Cinematographer Stuart Harris, Assistant Director Richard Lingard, and recent directing graduate Simon London. All three of these individuals had so much valuable knowledge to share and I learned so much from them.

Once we gained a base knowledge of filmmaking, it was time to prepare for our short films. We entered the preproduction phase, creating our script breakdowns, shot lists, storyboards, and production schedules. Finally, we spent a day shooting our films and another day editing the footage.
